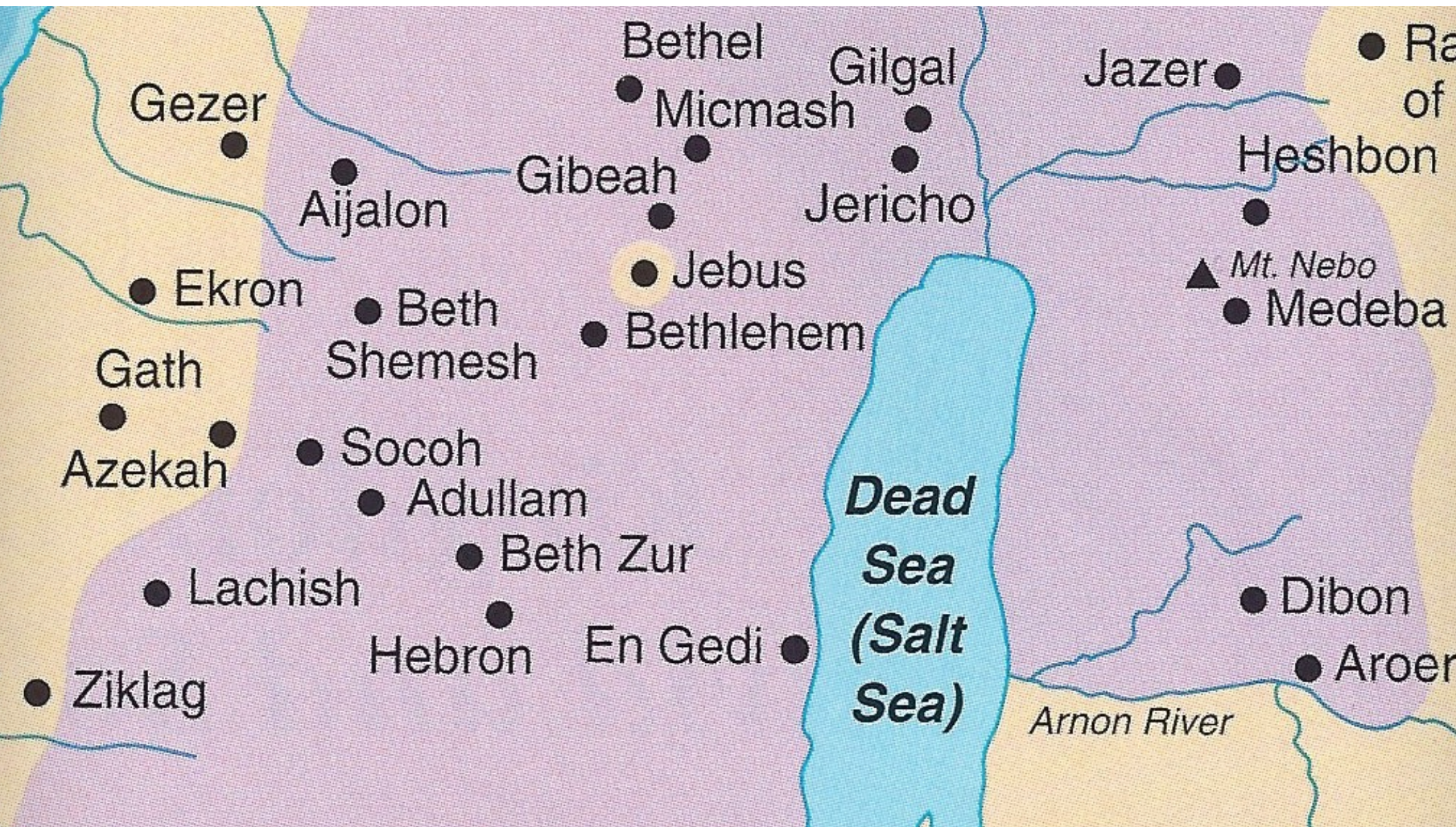



2Pe 2:7 ... He rescued **righteous** Lot, who was oppressed by the sensual conduct of unprincipled men



The Problem For Lot

Total Loss – Even His Wife

"Remember Lot's Wife"

Luk 17:28 ... in the days of Lot: they were eating, they were drinking, they were buying, they were selling, they were planting, they were building; but on the day that Lot went out from Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all.

It will be just the same on the day that the Son of Man is revealed.

On that day, the one who is on the housetop and whose goods are in the house must not go down to take them out; and likewise the one who is in the field must not turn back ...

Some Conclusions

1. The Lord is both Just and Merciful – He destroys the wicked but He rescues the Righteous
2. Lot's life burned up like wood, hay and stubble – and he is never mentioned in the OT again
3. Abraham is fearful and doubtful – but he stands as a bright light of faith compared to Lot
4. We should pray for our wicked culture – for the sake of the righteous in that culture
