Only do NOT take my son back there.



Gen. 24:23 Then he asked, "Whose daughter are you? ... is there room in your father's house for us to spend the night?"

Gen. 24:24 She answered... "I am the daughter of Bethuel, the son that Milcah (Lot's brother) bore to Nahor (Abraham's brother)

Gen. 24:26-27 Then the man bowed down and worshiped the LORD ... "Praise be to the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who has not abandoned his kindness (Hesed) and faithfulness to my master.

As for me, the LORD has led me on the journey to the house of my master's relatives.

Gen. 24:28 The girl ran (back to her home) and told her mother's household about these things.

- 24:62-67 Isaac takes Rebekah for his wife
