
Mahanaim "Two Camps"

Angels As Messengers

Gen. 28:12 He had a dream in which he saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven, and **the angels of God were ascending and descending on it ... Gen. 28:13** There above it stood the LORD, and he said: "I am the LORD, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying

Angels As Guards

Gen. 32:1 Jacob also went on his way, and **the angels of God met him Gen. 32:2** When Jacob saw them, he said, **"This is the camp of God!"** So he named that place **Mahanaim (***Two Camps***)**



Genesis 34-36

Jacob Must Move!

In the Narrative: How is Beth-El significant? How do you see Jacob's character in his sons? Gen. 34:1 Dinah went out to visit the women of the land.
Gen. 34:2 Shechem, son of Hamor, <u>saw her</u>, took her, laid with her, humiliated her.
Gen. 34:3 His heart (*Soul*) <u>was drawn</u> (*Clinging*) to Dinah daughter of Jacob, and <u>he loved</u> the girl and <u>spoke</u> tenderly to her.

Gen. 34:7 Now Jacob's sons had come in from the fields as soon as they heard what had happened. They were filled with grief and fury, because Shechem had done a disgraceful thing <u>in Israel</u> by lying with Jacob's daughter — a thing that should not be done.

Let's Make A Deal

Gen. 34:10 HAMOR: "You can settle among us; the land is open to you. Live in it, trade in it, and acquire property in it."

Gen. 34:12 SHECHEM: "Make the price for the bride and the gift I am to bring as great as you like, and I'll pay whatever you ask me. Only give me the girl as my wife."

Gen. 34:13 JACOB'S SONS: replied <u>deceitfully</u> as they spoke to Shechem and his father Hamor.
Gen. 34:15 "We will give our consent to you on one condition only: that you become like us by circumcising all your males."

Gen. 34:20 HAMOR and SHECHEM went to their fellow townsmen: Gen. 34:23 "Won't their livestock, their property and all their other animals <u>become ours</u>? So let us give our consent to them, and they will settle among us."


The Deal As A Deception

Gen. 34:25 Three days later, while all of them were still in pain, two of Jacob's sons, Simeon and Levi, Dinah's brothers, took their swords and attacked the unsuspecting city, killing every male.

Gen. 34:26 They put Hamor and his son Shechem to the sword and took Dinah from Shechem's house and left.


Gen. 34:27 The sons of Jacob came upon the dead bodies and looted the city where their sister had been defiled.

Gen. 34:30 Then Jacob said to Simeon and Levi, "You have brought trouble on me ..."



Gen. 35:1 God said to Jacob, "Go up to Bethel and settle there, and build an altar there to God, who appeared to you when you were fleeing from your brother Esau"

The Toledoth Of Esau

Gen. 36:1 This is the account of Esau (that is, Edom) ...

Gen. 36:6-8 Esau took his wives and sons and daughters and all the members of his household, as well as his livestock and all his other animals and all the goods he had acquired in Canaan, and moved to a land some distance from his brother Jacob. Their possessions were too great for them to remain together ... So Esau (that is, Edom) settled in the hill country of Seir.

Gen. 36:40-43 These were the chiefs descended from Esau ...
Timna, Alvah, Jetheth, Oholibamah, Elah,
Pinon, Kenaz, Teman, Mibzar, Magdiel and Iram.
These were the chiefs of Edom ...
This was Esau – the father of the Edomites
