The Purpose/Result Clauses

- **1Sa 31:8** The next day, when the Philistines came <u>to</u> *strip the slain*, they found Saul and his three sons fallen on Mount Gilboa.
- **1Sa 31:9** So they cut off his head and stripped off his armor and sent messengers throughout the land of the Philistines, <u>to</u> *carry the good news* to the house of their idols and to the people.
- **2Sa 1:14** David said to him, "How is it you were not afraid [you should have seen the folly of his purpose] to put out your hand to destroy the LORD's anointed?"
- **2Sa 2:23** But he refused to turn aside. Therefore Abner struck him in the stomach with the butt of his spear, so that the spear came out at his back. [it is not real clear that Abner's intent was to kill him—but that is the result] And he fell there and died where he was. And all who came to the place where Asahel had fallen and died, stood still.
- **2Sa 3:9** God do so to Abner and more also, if I do not accomplish for David what the LORD has sworn to him, **10 to transfer the kingdom** from the house of Saul and **[to] set up the throne** of David over Israel and over Judah, from Dan to Beersheba."

2Sa 3:21 And Abner said to David, "I will arise and go and will gather all Israel to my lord the king, *that* they may make a covenant with you, and *that* you may reign over all that your heart desires." So David sent Abner away, and he went in peace.

2Sa 3:25 You know that Abner the son of Ner came <u>to</u> **deceive** you and <u>to</u> **know** your going out and your coming in, and <u>to</u> **know** all that you are doing."

2Sa 3:27 And when Abner returned to Hebron, Joab took him aside into the midst of the gate to speak with him privately, [we don't know what Joab told Abner his purpose for the meeting was, but this is the result] and there he struck him in the stomach, **so that he died**, for the blood of Asahel his brother.

2Sa 3:35 Then all the people came <u>to persuade</u> David to eat bread while it was yet day.

2Sa 4:6 And they came into the midst of the house <u>as if to</u> get wheat, [this is another example of a deceptive purpose—but not their real goal] and they stabbed him in the stomach. Then Rechab and Baanah his brother escaped.
