



1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; Fools despise wisdom and instruction.

Knowledge cannot begin without respect (*and love*) for God All knowledge originates with God and comes from God "in **the beginning** God …" **ba-rasheet**

The wise man loves the LORD and knows the LORD, so that the LORD gives him Wisdom through instruction (discipline and correction) that he willingly and humbly accepts.

The foolish man ignores the LORD and, because he is self sufficient and arrogant, he despises instruction (discipline and correction), therefore he can not gain Wisdom. (*Some fools NEVER gain wisdom*)

1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; Fools despise wisdom and instruction.



- 1. Patee: The "simpleton". Young. Naive.
- 2. Caseel: Hates learning and knowledge. Stupid.
- 3. Aveel: Lacks common sense, morals. Insolent.
- 4. Naval: Disgraceful and arrogant. Denies God.
- 5. Laits: The "scoffer". No correction *ever* possible.
