Manasseh and Amon
2 Kings 21 2 Chron 33 Isaiah 36-39

Charles Spurgeon called King Manasseh one the “Seven Wonders of Grace.” As we go through the story of his life, you will see that it is really true: “*Grace, Grace, God’s Grace, truly is greater than all our sin!*” After a brief period of revival and blessing under Hezekiah, the wickedness continues under Manasseh. But then he repents and, for a time, it looks as if there is hope. Until he dies and his son, Amon, takes over. Then it’s back to normal; normal in the way of the world, not in the will of God “*as it is in Heaven.*”
