Week 36 Zedekiah

2 Kings 24 2 Chron 36 Jeremiah Ezekiel

The final years of the kingdom of Judah were marked by a power struggle between the Egyptians and the Babylonians. Babylon was the rising power that had overtaken the Assyrian Empire. As Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon grew ever more powerful, he finished off the Egyptians and seized control of the Mediterranean coast. Then Nebuchadnezzar placed Zedekiah on the throne of Judah as a puppet king, but he rebelled. So Nebuchadnezzar attacked Jerusalem and after a nearly two year siege, captured the city. Zedekiah fled. He ran out into the night through a hole in the city wall, but was trapped near Jericho. Babylonian soldiers took him to Riblah, where he was judged and punished by Nebuchadnezzar. Then the Babylonian army completely destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple and, as Jeremiah said, "wiped like a plate."
