

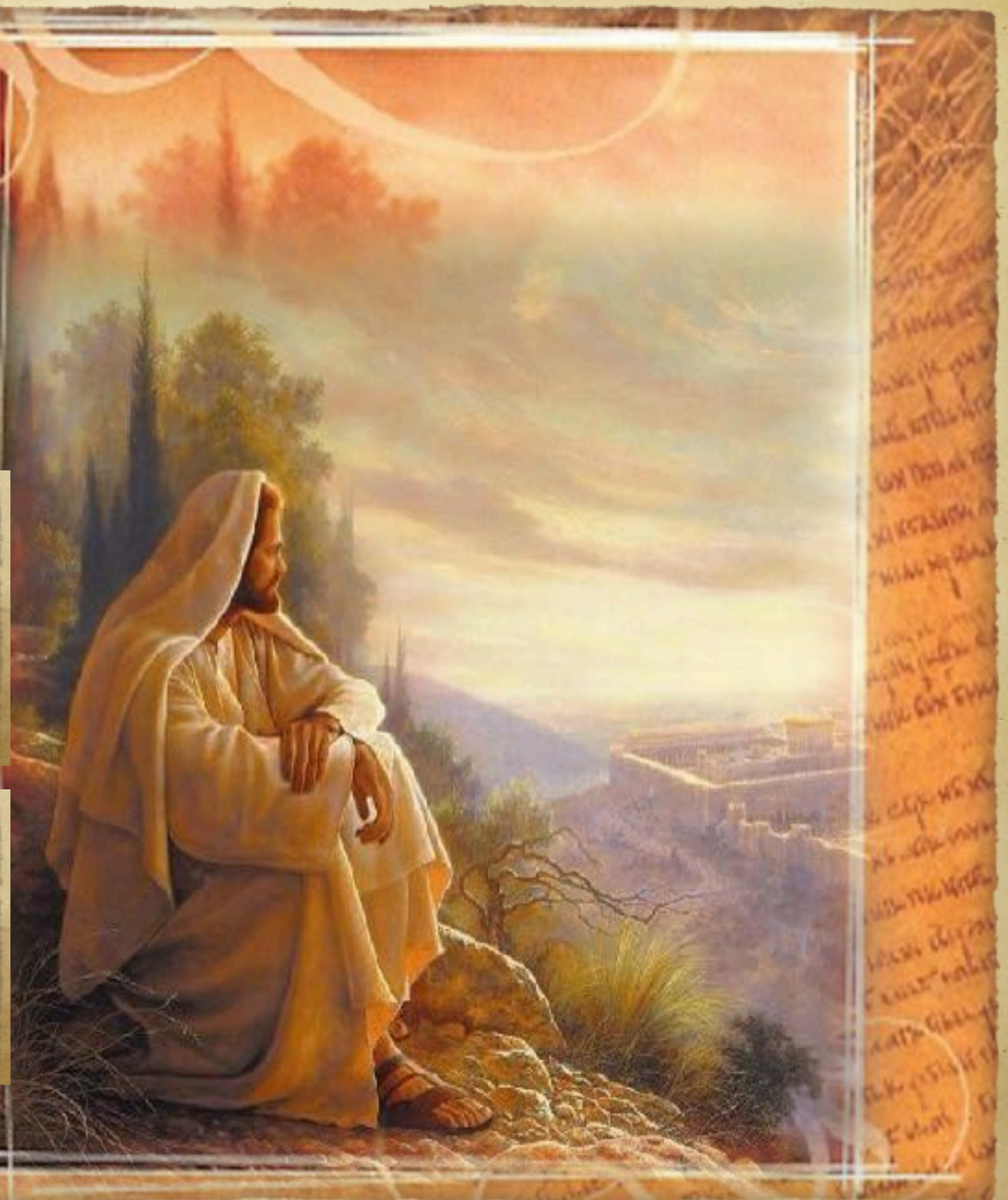

Jesus arrives in Bethany near sundown. The rest of the caravan goes on to Jerusalem. They announce to the city " <i>Jesus of Nazareth is here!</i> " [Keep in mind Jesus did not attend the year before.]	Jesus invited to the house of Simon in Bethany for "end of Sabbath" meal Mary anoints Jesus for burial Judas is rebuked—devises a sinister plan. Mat and Mk record this scene as a "flashback" in order to tie it with the deal Judas makes with the Sanhedrin on Tuesday eve.	Messianic Presentation — "Triumphal Entry" into Jerusalem Jesus told the Pharisees in Perea "you will not see me until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!'" Lk 13:34 This is partly fulfilled this day. It will be fully fulfilled when He returns in Glory. As in Galilee the year before, they want a King w/o a Cross. Returns to Bethany near sundown	Messianic Power — Curses a fig tree on the way into the Temple "Cleanses" the Temple of corruption (for the second time) Greeks seek Him Returns to Bethany near sundown	Messianic Controversy — The fig tree is withered Hard parables Hard questions Harsh words Jesus tells the Apostles of His Return... <i>The Olivet Discourse</i> Late in the day. Judas makes his deal with the Sanhedrin to betray Jesus sometime during the night Returns to Bethany near sundown	Messianic Silence — No activity recorded in the Gospels. Jesus is preparing for His last Passover. Judas and the Sanhedrin are preparing for His arrest. Remains in Bethany	Messianic Preparation — Peter and John sent to prepare the Passover They gather after sunset. Jesus washed the feet, Judas leaves. Lord's Passover Remembrance is instituted Judas has betrayed Jesus. Brings guard to arrest Him Jesus goes to Gethsemane Suffers Agony	Messianic Rejection — Jesus arrested very early Friday. The Trials 1. <i>Annas</i> 2. <i>Sanhedrin</i> 3. <i>"Dawn" Trial</i> 4. <i>Pilate</i> 5. <i>Herod</i> 6. <i>Pilate</i> Jesus scourged. Crowds call for crucifixion. Jesus mocked. Judas hangs himself. Jesus bears His cross. He dies at 3pm while lambs are being killed His side is pierced. He is buried as leaders prepare for Passover	Messianic Rest — The 1st Day of "Unleavened Bread" The Jewish leaders request that Pilate sets a seal and posts a guard on the tomb	Messianic Resurrection — The Feast of "First Fruits" The tomb is <i>EMPTY</i> Jesus appears to: 1. <i>Mary Magdalene</i> 2. <i>Women come to prepare His body</i> 3. <i>Road to Emmaus</i> 4. <i>Peter</i> 5. <i>All the Apostles [exc. Thomas]</i> 6. <i>More than 500 disciples</i>	

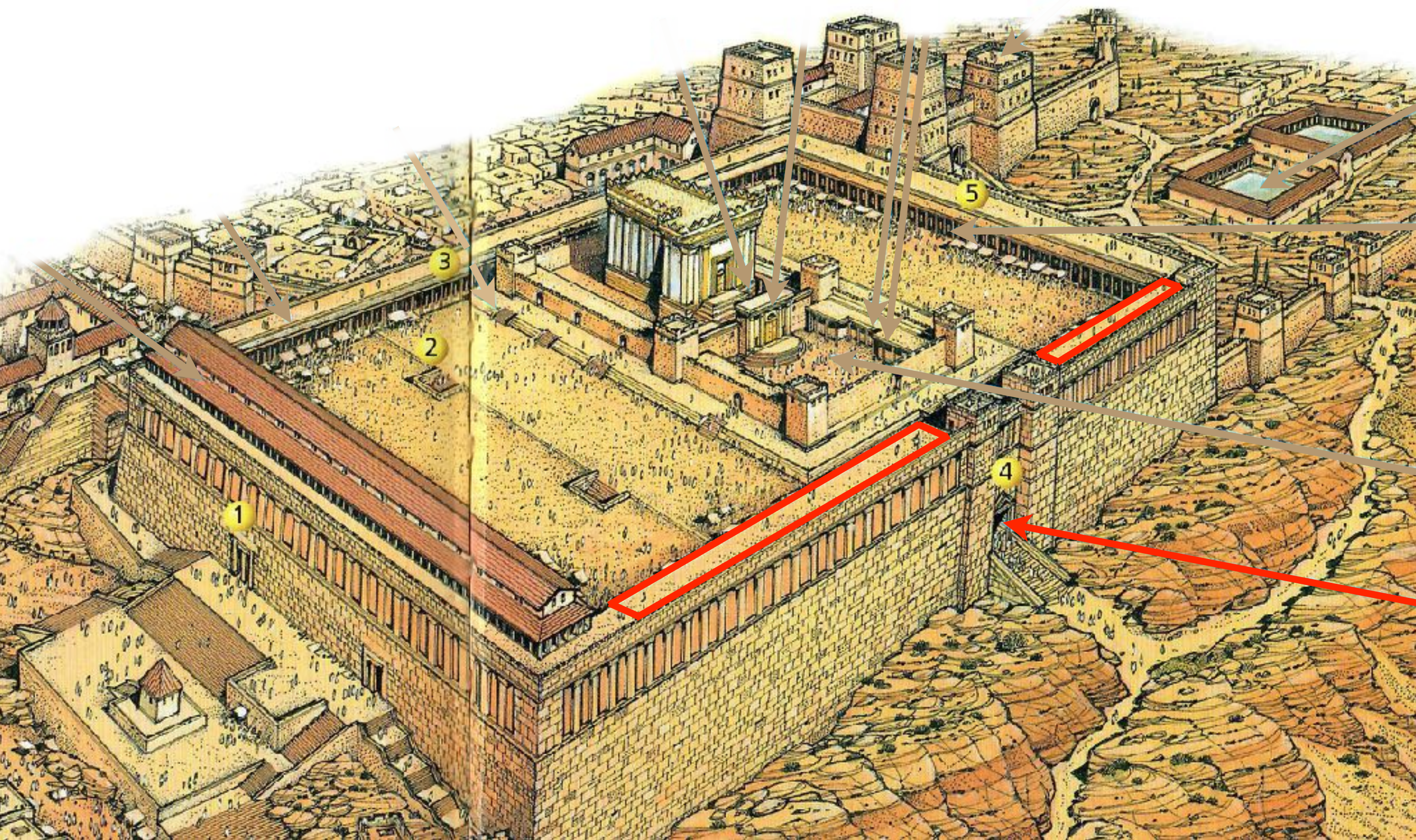

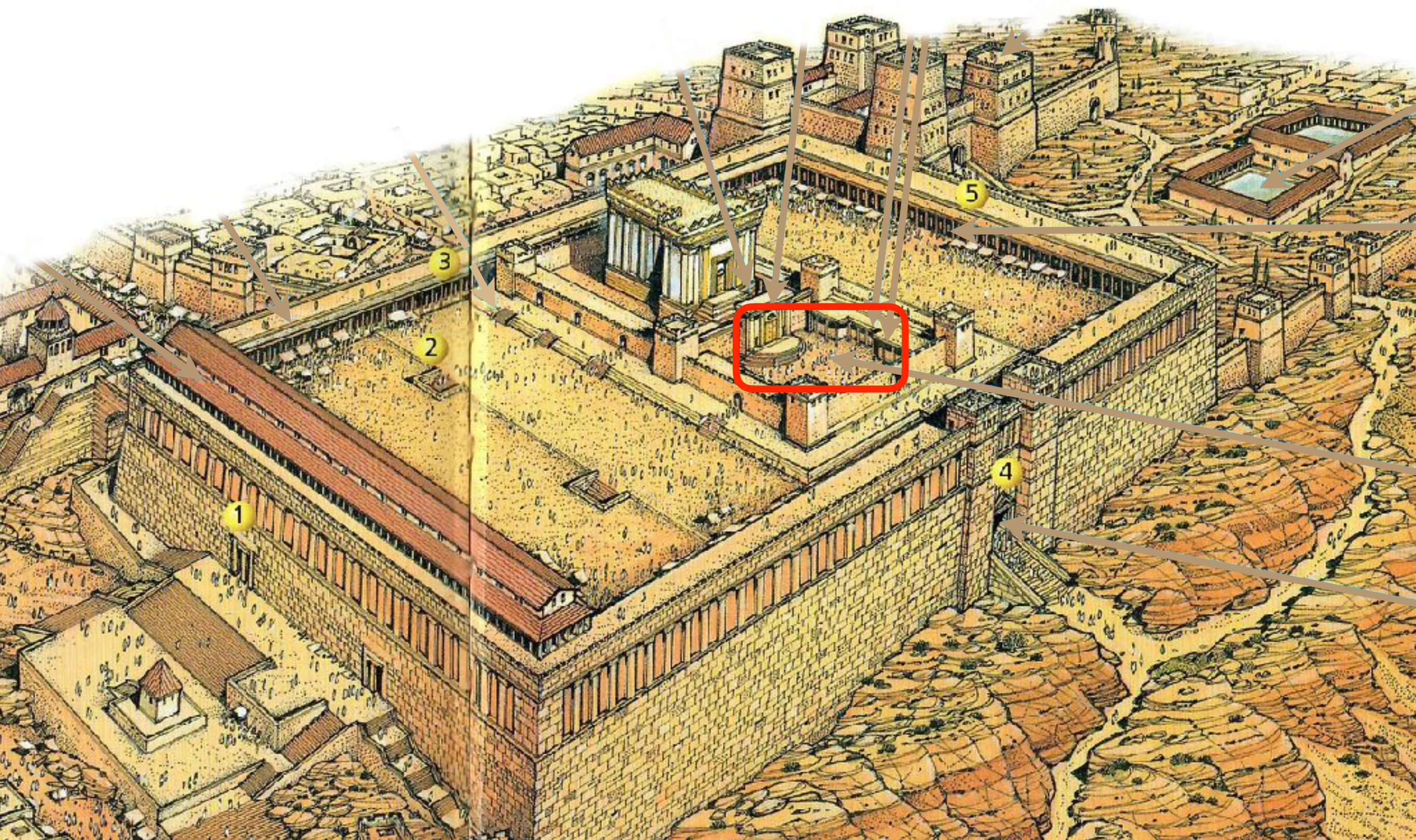

Isa 5:7 For **the vineyard** of the LORD of hosts **is the house of Israel, and the men of Judah** are his pleasant **planting**; and he looked for justice **(grapes)**, but behold, bloodshed; for righteousness **(grapes)**, but behold, an outcry!

Isa 27:2 **In that day,** “A pleasant vineyard, sing of it!

Isa 27:3 I, the LORD, am its keeper; every moment I water it. Lest anyone punish it, I keep it night and day...

Isa 27:6 **In days to come** Jacob shall take root, Israel shall blossom and put forth shoots and fill the whole world with fruit. **(Grapes!)**
